

## ‘Epilogue’ Bookstore

Outgoing Library Director, Nicki Lynch, had a wonderful idea that a used bookstore would be a good addition to Samuels Library, a good project for the Friends of Samuels Library organization and a good solution to all the donated books by our generous community. After months and months of planning and design, a new, gently-used bookstore opened in the main hall of Samuels Library on May 2, 2017.

During the month of April while construction was in progress FOSL held a contest to name the bookstore. Many creative suggestions were collected and the Friends Board voted to name the store “Epilogue.”

The store is staffed completely by volunteers, the store’s merchandise consists of used books, DVDs and CDs donated by Library patrons and the profits will be used to support the library. *With the store’s opening, FOSL expanded membership benefits to include a 20% discount for all FOSL members shopping in the bookstore!*

The bookstore was made possible through a generous donation by Ms. Joyce Jenkins-Wimmer and the architectural talents of Mr. Fred Andreae. Eileen Grady worked with the county and the contractors to make it all happen. FOSL is indebted to the efforts of so many in our community who made donations and gave their time to make the bookstore a reality.
